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**Fee Schedule and Contract for Services**

Please **read this carefully**, as this describes the terms of our agreement if you request services.

**Expert Witness Services**

The fee for forensic records analysis, verbal opinions or written reports is \$350 per hour for Dr. Taylor. The fee for depositions and court appearances (both of which will require a retainer for 10 hours of services) is \$400 per hour.

**Forensic Evaluations**

Evaluations include detailed history, mental status examination, and verbal or brief written report. Review of voluminous records and lengthy, detailed written report preparation, if needed, are also charged at standard hourly rates. The fees are \$350 per hour in-office and \$400 per hour out-of-office, plus travel time and expenses. Attorneys, relatives and other representatives should not sit in on forensic evaluations. Persons seen for litigation or claims evaluation do not have confidentiality or a doctor-patient relationship. Clients agree to pay for reserved time and evaluation fee if forensic work is cancelled less than 24 hours prior to the scheduled day of the work, or if the patient fails to appear for an appointment. Clients agree that Dr. Taylor will only testify with respect to clinical and scientific matters.

**Accounting Information**

Invoices are payable upon receipt. All invoices are billed in U.S. dollars. **Federal Tax ID # 72-1389024.** Retainers are based on task. Retaining party agrees to be responsible for all fees, even if multiple parties make partial payments.

**Travel Considerations**

All time required for out-of-office meetings, projects and court appearances will be billed, including local travel time. Travel time and expenses are added to costs of out-of-office evaluations, meetings, depositions, and court appearances. In cases involving travel, you will be billed the normal out-of-pocket cost for round-trip travel to the location of service, regardless of final destination (airfare, ground transportation, lodging, rental of conference rooms for evaluations, mileage, parking, etc.) You will also be billed for any additional expenses required due to last minute changes or special requests. Reservations for some conference rooms and some airline tickets are nonrefundable and will be charged to you if an appointment is cancelled. Hotel rooms usually can be cancelled without penalty except at the last minute -- but not always. Telephone and shipping charges are not billed except for voluminous amounts, Federal Express, couriers, extended conference calls, etc. Photocopy fee is \$0.25/page and facsimile fee is \$1.00/page when charged (nominal quantities during normal office hours are typically waived).

Dr. Taylor does not perform forensic work on contingency or liens.
