Dr. Michael Treister was Board Certified in orthopaedic surgery in 1974 and was recertified in both orthopaedic and hand surgery in 1983. His undergraduate degree from Franklin and Marshall College in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, is in American History. He obtained his Doctor of Medicine degree from Washington University Medical School in St. Louis, Missouri, in 1967. Then he completed a surgical internship and orthopaedic residency and hand surgery fellowship at Northwestern University completing his post-graduate training in December of 1971. After serving as an orthopaedic surgeon in the United States Air Force for 2 years at Clark Air Force Base in the Philippines with the rank of Major, he returned to Chicago in January of 1974 to begin the private practice of orthopaedic and hand surgery. He has constantly practiced in some of the same Chicago hospitals for 32 years. A few years ago, after many years of reserve military service, he was honorably discharged from the Air Force.

Dr. Treister's general orthopaedic practice in Chicago has included areas of special interest including arthroscopic surgery, spine surgery, and hand surgery. He has served on the staff of several Chicago hospitals and has had extensive experience with trauma. In addition to his busy orthopaedic practice, over the years Dr. Treister has served as a consultant to major insurance companies and their attorneys as well as to numerous plaintiff attorneys. In addition to serving as a medical expert, he has participated in establishing utilization review protocols, and performing medical chart reviews for medical necessity, appropriateness of care, and causal relationships. He has frequently commented upon injury and disease progression and prognosis, and is known for his application of the quadratic equation to progressive orthopaedic deterioration.

It is estimated that Dr. Treister and doctors working for Treister Orthopaedic Services have treated in excess of 100,000 patients since Dr. Treister founded the group in Chicago in 1974.

For the past several years Dr. Treister's medical-legal work has been equally divided between plaintiff and defense cases. During the past 3 years some plaintiff verdicts in excess of one million dollars and some "not guilty" defense verdicts after testimony by Dr. Treister have led to the situation where most cases have been settled when he is the medical expert, and he has been required to make few court appearances.

For several years he chaired the Peer Review Committee of the Chicago Medical Society, The Physician Stress Study Committee, and more recently has chaired its Technology Committee, and currently
