State of Texas v. Robert Sterling Gray. Murder. 33rd District Court, Blanco County, TX. Testified at trial as an expert in use of force and self-defense. Jury returned a verdict of Not Guilty. Attorneys: Michelle Moore and Jared Williams (512-756-5441).

Burks v. City of Humble, et al. Case No. 4:24-cv-00756. U.S. District Court, Southern District of Texas. Federal civil rights action under 42 U.S.C. § 1983 alleging excessive force by a police officer firing into an occupied vehicle. Testified in a pre-trial deposition as an expert in police procedure and use of force. Following the deposition, the defense filed a motion to exclude my testimony, which the court denied.
