FEE SCHEDULE

The fee schedule for Scott Marine Surveyors effective 1/01/2022 is as follows:

- 1) Vessel Damage Claims are billed at \$150/hour from port to port plus expenses.
- 2) A \$7,500 minimum non-refundable retainer is required for any case involving expert Witness work and is a minimum fee for accepting the assignment. Expert Witness work is billed at \$250/hour from port to port plus expenses against the retainer. The retainer will be required to be refilled once billing has been exhausted the retainer with \$1,000 remaining.
- 3) Deposition appearance and pretrial preparation is billed at \$300/ hour from port to port plus expenses with a 6 hour minimum payable in hand 1 week prior to the date of the deposition. 48 hour notice of cancellation is required or the funds are not refunded and a new deposit will be required. All pretrial bills are due in hand 1 week prior to testifying in court. Failure to comply with any part of this section voids any agreement for testimony and/or subpoena in force for the appearance.
- 4) Court time is billed at \$5,000 per day plus expenses. Payment is due in hand for the first day of court time 1 week in advance. 48 hour notice of cancellation is required or the funds are not refundable and a new deposit will be required. Subsequent days of testimony are due in hand on that day. Expenses will be billed on an estimate prior to trial and are to be included in the first day payment. Subsequent expenses will be billed daily. A charge of \$1500 per day is charged on stand-by and travel days plus expenses. Failure to comply with any part of this section voids any agreement for testimony and/or subpoena in force for the appearance.
- 5) Any outstanding bills past 30 days are overdue and subject to an interest charge of 2% per month. A non-payment fee of \$200 per month will also be added. Any and all fees regarding collection of overdue invoices including attorney fees and our collection efforts at the court time billing rate will also be the responsibility of the billed individual and any other responsible legal entity involved in the case.
- 6) Condition and Valuation survey are priced individually depending on the circumstances.
- 7) Appraisals are conducted on an agreed fee based on a normal appraisal condition and will be paid prior to the appraisal. Any additional time over and above the normal work will be due prior to issuance of the report and will be given to all parties at the conclusion of the examination and receipt of payment. Any information required after the appraisal is issued, with the exception of one phone per the parties represented, will require a \$3,000 retainer and will be billed at \$300 per hour.
