General Experience

Linda Martin Barber is a Director of Navigant Consulting and a senior member of the firm's Insurance and Reinsurance Consulting Practice. 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liability, workers comp, personal lines, and assumed reinsurance claims. In 1996 she moved to Envision Claim Management where she had responsibility for the largest asbestos, hazardous waste, and other long tail claims of the Talegen companies.

Mrs. Barber was Vice President of the CIGNA Companies from 1981-1994, serving in a number of capacities. In the Legal Division she was responsible for counseling CIGNA's property & casualty companies, including compliance and regulatory matters, business litigation, reinsurance disputes and claims. Throughout her career at CIGNA she was involved in all aspects of underwriting and coverage disputes. In 1990, Mrs. Barber became Vice President, Major Claims with responsibility for asbestos, hazardous waste, and other long tail claims.

Throughout her career at CIGNA, Mrs. Barber was involved in extensive reengineering and Total Quality Management projects. As head of a Corporate Task Force with responsibility for reviewing CIGNA's reinsurance runoff she led an intensive review of more than a dozen books of business in London and Bermuda. She developed recommendations for centralized management of the books and updated reinsurance claim handling. Subsequently, Mrs. Barber joined Project Oar, the task force of P&C senior managers and outside consultants charged with changing the way in which CIGNA's P&C Group did business. In particular, she was involved in reengineering the underwriting process.

At the law firm of Ballard, Spahr, Andrews & Ingersoll during the years 1976-81, Mrs. Barber worked on a diverse array of lawsuits as a member of the firm's litigation department.

Mrs. Barber is a member of the Pennsylvania Bar and the International Association of Insurance Receivers. She is a certified reinsurance arbitrator, a member of ARIAS, US and an invited member of the Reinsurance Dispute Resolution Task Force. She has served as a Director of the Pollution Liability Insurance Association.
